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## **Michael Doret**

Michael Doret, Los Angeles-based handletterer and founder of Alphabet Soup, has held on to quite a lot of the sketches that he's done duting a four-decade career. Looking back over Doret's work, and specifically over these sketches, he says it becomes clear how much he was influenced by growing up in Brooklyn near Coney Island, the Brooklyn Dodgers, and Times Square. "There's nothing subtle about what I do, and it is all pretty much reflective of my love for low-brow signage, storefronts, billboards, sports ephemera, old movies, and anything and everything related to midcentury American pop culture. I can't help myself, and I can't keep these themes from bubbling to the surface."

Some artists create sketches that can stand on their own as works of art. "I do not believe that mine fall into this category," Doret says, "as they are all roughly drawn stand-ins for work that is intended to be much more tightly rendered. Perhaps what is distinct about them is the variety of approaches that I create for a single assignment that, although they are different, manage to fall into a single genre. If I try to look at my sketches as an outsider, I think that I might be struck by the endless design possibilities inherent in the twenty-six letters of the alphabet; that combining them with other design elements can open up endless varieties of imagery."
